BACKGROUND/CONTEXT

School supplies pose a significant expense to families on a yearly basis, particularly for families who may be low-income or struggling to meet other financial needs. However, they are vastly important in the ability of children to participate in and succeed within the educational system. The back-to-school carnival hosted by the CCYSCN seeks to address this need and distribute backpacks and school supplies to families every year.

Each year, CCYSCN holds a back-to-school carnival to help the children of the North Philadelphia community get ready for the new school year with backpacks filled with school supplies as well as providing families with health resources. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the 12th annual carnival was primarily a backpack drive and school lunch meal distribution along with some entertainment set up in tents in the parking lot. To prepare for the backpack drive and carnival this year, we aided in fundraising, planning and ordering the supplies for the backpacks. The main project we undertook was coordinating the stuffing and distribution of over 5,000 backpacks as well as organization and distribution of health educational and resource packets
