PROJECT

- Assisted guests at Joseph's House with their medical care
- Made educational resources for COVID-19, addiction medicine, cardiovascular health, smoking cessation, and dental health.
- Referred the guests to the appropriate services to improve their health.
- Assisted at the shelter's service fairs and recruited more guests at the shelter.
- Encouraged COVID vaccination and ensured site safety with COVID rapid tests.

Soojin Kim – "The BTG experience made me realize how a system could fail to serve its people. People more than often fall through the cracks and never are given the chance to achieve their fullest potential. Such experience estranges patients from seeking the care they need in the future."
