
- Summer Scholars

## Project Description


- Design and implement TWO apprenticeship programs for the YES summer scholars
- Apprenticeships...
  - Introduce and foster necessary work and life skills
  - Require students to complete a final project that is showcased at the end-of-summer symposium
  - Support academic and career preparation goals
  - Build aspirational capital amongst students

## Secondary Project Description

- Concise, one-page document that summarizes proposed ideas for YES and potential contacts for Stop the Bleed training
- YES has undergone internal restructuring within the past few years and could use support with...
  - Emergency contact and response protocol and hierarchy
  - Preparedness training for emergency situations
  - CPR/First-Aid training
  - Clinical staffing

## Pittsburgh Palate Apprenticeship Course

- Throughout this course the students...
  - Discovered the different cultures present within Pittsburgh
  - Investigated their own familial culture and how it left an imprint on their life
- Skills Developed:
  - Website creation, blog writing, cultural humility, public speaking, conversation skills
- Final Project:
  - Each student will choose a recipe of choice that represents their culture and make it at the Community Engagement Center in Homewood

## Project Evaluation

### Evaluation for quality and utility:

- Ease of implementation by other instructors
- Student feedback
- Completion rate of final project
- Implementation of recommendation and guidelines

### To improve on YES:

- Introducing the apprenticeship course earlier on
- Emphasizing that the roles of the summer scholars in these apprenticeships are employees, not students
  - Explicitly stating that it is a type of work experience, not an academic course
- Highlight disciplinary expectations of interns

## Summary Results

Apprenticeship deliverables are to be completed by the end of the course

- Not all courses will be completed before the 28th of July
- There has been a 100% completion rate for the courses that have concluded

The YES administration has received the resource guide and can use it for their emergency and first aid response as they see fit.

## Summary

Working with YES was an enriching experience that involved...

- Mentoring the summer scholar's cohort
- Helping facilitate supplementary courses such as YPAR, a research course
- Attending and assisting the 2023 Teen Violence Prevention Summit
- Building rapport with students and supporting their passions
- Adapting content and delivery of courses and instruction to accommodate the needs and interests of the students
