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UUH OUTREACH


UUH Outreach provides individualized quality professional care that is responsive to the physical, emotional, and intellectual needs of older adults in the

Northwest Philadelphia community. UUH Outreach provides a wide range of services such as social work support, health promotion, and access to community funds to help older adults make ends meet. Additionally, the staff nurse assists clients via health consultations to help them better understand their care plans and ensure healthy living. UUH Outreach partners with multiple community agencies to ensure that older adults in Northwest Philadelphia have access to as many resources as possible.

CONTEXT

ACCOMPLISHMENTS/CHALLENGES/JOYS

The Northwest Philadelphia UUH Outreach clients are primarily people of color, low-income older adults who have been living in the area for decades, if not their whole lives. Many clients qualify for a number of state-assistance programs that can be overwhelming to manage for an individual.

Challenges:

Barriers to resources

- Digitizing the bureaucratic process creates obstacles for elders trying to access city or state services who are unfamiliar with computers or smartphones.
- Many elders are bound to their homes due to health issues or no longer being able to drive, increasing the difficulty in accessing not just government services, but also community resources, healthcare, food, and more.

TEAM'S EXPERIENCE

The primary roles for the 2023 intern were assisting clients with decluttering of their homes, assessing community needs, referring clients to UUH staff who can assist them with their needs, preparing and delivering a presentation for the community on oral health, and increasing food access through the delivery of meals and helping clients sign up for fresh produce vouchers. The intern was involved in at-home client visits, making phone calls to clients, and compiling client resources. Additionally, the intern engaged with and learned about a variety of programs and funds accessible to older adults in Northwest Philly, such as Philadelphia Corporation for Aging's emergency fund, multiple heat-relief programs providing AC units to Philadelphians, Center in the Park and its associated programs, and more.

Accumulation

 Issues such as recent downsizing, physical disability, and mental health struggles lead to several clients needing assistance in decreasing the amount of clutter in their homes. This is particularly important in a population where fall risk is a major concern.
